### Sunday 14th June 2020 - Bursledon Brickworks

Travelling on a vintage double decker courtesy of Friends of King Alfred Buses we are off for a guided tour of Bursledon Brickworks following on from the talk by Bob Wilson in February. Departing from Broadway, Winchester (north side adjacent to St John's House) by 9.30 am in our 1956 Leyland Titan we will arrive in good time for our 2hr tour starting at 10.30 am. This is a little before normal opening time so the cafe won't be open but other facilities will be available. Time for refreshments if you fancy though before we depart for our return at around 2pm. If you wish to drive rather than travel on the bus, please arrive by 10.20am latest. However the charge will remain at £15.00 pp to ensure we are able to cover costs.

**Saturday 11th July 2020 - Annual picnic and walk**

Join us for a walk in the New Forest with Lawrence Shaw, Archaeological Officer with the Park Authority. To cater for all walking abilities you can choose from a 2/3 km walk to learn something of the history of the Gunpowder Factory starting at 10am or a longer multi-period walk starting at 1.30pm to view Roman pottery kilns and a medieval hunting lodge as well as the Gunpowder Factory. Both walks will start from Fritham Car Park. There is a good sized open green space next to the car park for us to all get together at 12noon to share a picnic.

**Monday 3rd or 10th August 2020 - Walking tour of the religious houses of medieval Winchester**

Once again numbers for this walk are limited so there is a choice of dates. Departing from St John's Hospital on the Broadway at 7pm, this walking tour will take in the sites and remains of many of the monasteries, friaries, and hospitals of medieval Winchester and explore their impact on the city, both then and now. Our guide is Thom Hayes of Pre- Construct Archaeology who tells us, "Where the monasteries and nunneries were places of contemplation and seclusion, the friaries focussed on outreach and the hospitals on care; all forms of religious life but with different outputs and impact. With over ten religious houses operating in medieval Winchester at its peak, the impact that these institutions had on the city was significant and can still be seen and felt today."
